



Articulation Agreement

AAS Cybersecurity
transfer to bachelor's degree



This Agreement is made between Black Hawk College (BHC) and Governors State University (GSU), collectively the Parties, to set forth the terms and conditions of engaging in an educational program and to facilitate the transfer of students who earn, or enroll in courses leading to, an **Associate of Applied Science in Cybersecurity (AAS-Cyber) degree**. BHC and GSU jointly support the goal of students attaining an AAS-Cyber degree and a bachelor's degree through this Agreement. This Agreement does not prevent students from participating in additional programs established between the Parties to the extent the programs are applicable to Applied Science degrees such as dual admission, dual enrollment, guaranteed admission and reverse transfer programs. BHC and GSU will maintain the integrity of their separate admission and academic programs and enter into this Agreement as equal and cooperating partner institutions.

Purpose

This Agreement between BHC and GSU is intended to increase academic opportunity, minimize duplication of instruction and enhance career pathways by providing a seamless curriculum transition for BHC AAS students who transfer to GSU to earn a bachelor's degree.

This Agreement is designed for students who follow a prescribed plan of study leading to an Associate of Applied Science degree. As outlined in the Appendices to this Agreement, the BHC credits transferred will be included in the total credit hours required for the bachelor's degree. All other standard admission, curriculum and graduation requirements of the Parties must also be met.

Program Articulation

The Parties agree that any student who has earned the **AAS-Cyber** degree may transfer the credits from their program, as outlined in the attached Appendices, to GSU toward the

- **Interdisciplinary Studies BA**
- **Information Technology BS**

This Agreement specifically allows the transfer of **up to eighty (80) total credits including up to thirty-seven (37) general education credits** from BHC to GSU. A grade of "C" or better is required to award transfer credit toward general education and a "D" or better is required to award transfer credit towards electives. This Agreement conforms to the BHC and GSU residency requirements, and the GSU upper-division requirements, as stipulated in each Parties' catalog at time of Agreement signing.

Student Data and Support

The Parties agree to track the progress and success of this Agreement by cooperatively determining data points that track the admission, retention and degree completion of students pursuing the programs under this Agreement, and report the agreed upon data to each other annually. The Parties will co-advise students in a manner that respects institutional requirements and practices and provides a supportive and unified transfer experience.

Marketing

Each Party grants to the other permission to use, display, reproduce, and publish, without compensation, each other's trademarks and other promotional and branding materials for the sole purpose of informing interested parties about this Agreement on websites, cobranded web portals, and

in-print marketing publications, with such use conforming to the marketing standards each sets forth. Minimally, the Parties will provide access to this Agreement and Appendices, including any mutually approved modifications, and advising contacts on their respective public websites.

Each Party shall have the opportunity to review in advance any information included on, but not limited to, the aforementioned platforms. Each Party reserves the right to terminate, suspend, or reject the other's use or proposed use of that Party's intellectual property.

Implementation Oversight and Communication

The Parties reserve the right to revise or eliminate programs and courses. The Parties will communicate annually concerning curriculum changes that may affect the agreed upon program relationship. Accreditation

The Parties will ensure they maintain in good standing their respective accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission and ensure that all operations will be in keeping with the accreditation requirements of their own institution. Any change in accreditation status will be reported by the affected Party to the other Party within thirty (30) calendar day of the change.

Term / Modification / Renewal / Termination

This Agreement will be in effect immediately upon final signing, be reviewed annually by the Parties, and will remain in effect for a period of 3 years. This Agreement may be modified by mutual, written agreement of both Parties. This Agreement will automatically renew for 3-year terms unless either party notifies the other in writing by December 31 of the year preceding the last year of the Agreement of their intention for modification or nonrenewal.

Either Party may terminate this Agreement for convenience upon one hundred eighty (180) days prior written notice to the other Party. Further, either Party may terminate this Agreement immediately upon substantial breach by the other Party. In the event of termination, students whose admission to GSU has been accepted under this Agreement will be allowed to transfer to GSU according to the agreement terms in effect immediately prior to termination, and students will then stay continuously enrolled in BHC and/or GSU and make satisfactory academic progress.



Entire Agreement


This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, and all prior discussions, agreements and understandings, whether verbal or in writing, are hereby merged into this Agreement.


