Get ready for the 2025-26 FAFSA!

What you can do now...

- ❑ **Determine which FAFSA to complete.** A new FAFSA is released each year, so make sure you submit the right one!

Attending college	Fall 2024, Spring 2025, and Summer 2025	Fall 2025, Spring 2026 and Summer 2026

- ❑ **Determine whose information will be included.** Most students under age 24 will have to include parent information. FAFSA parents are:
 - Biological/adoptive parents
 - If biological/adoptive parents are divorced or separated, report the parent who provided the most financial support during the past 12 months.
 - If that parent is remarried, their spouse will also be included on the FAFSA.

- ❑ **Determine who needs an FSA ID (username and password).**
Visit www.studentaid.gov/create-account.
 - The student must have an FSA ID. If the student is married but filed taxes separately, the student's spouse must also have an FSA ID.
 - If parent information is required, a FAFSA parent must also have their own FSA ID. If that FAFSA parent is married but filed taxes separately, then their spouse must also have their own FSA ID.
 - Previously submitted a FAFSA online? You should already have an FSA ID that you'll continue to use. Visit www.studentaid.gov/fsa-id.
- ❑ **Create your FSA ID now!** It takes 2-3 days for a new FSA ID to be verified before it can be fully used.
- ❑ **Save FSA ID information EXACTLY as entered.** When a student enters parent information on the FAFSA, it must match the parent's FSA ID information EXACTLY. Extra spaces or abbreviations can prevent the FAFSA from linking to the parent's account.
- ❑ **Determine family size.** If taxes were filed, the FAFSA will automatically calculate family size using the number of taxpayers and their dependents. If other dependents living in the household were not included (and the taxpayer provides more than half of their support), calculate the correct family size and be prepared to update the family size when prompted on the FAFSA.
